# Keeping our Children Safe

All our children must be accompanied to and from school by an adult and taken to their group leader in the Nursery. The Health and Safety of your child is our responsibility during school hours. Please ensure that whilst waiting to come into school, you are aware of the safety of your child. We respectfully ask that you keep your child close to you and that they are not allowed to run around on the school carpark.

Once children have been dismissed to your care at the end of the session, the responsibility for their health and safety lies with you as their parent/carer. Our Safeguarding Policy reflects the Local Council's recommendations and the Government Document "Keeping Children Safe In Education". This includes the handling of medicines, child protection issues, the level of training accessed by staff in accident procedures, methods of reporting and informing concerns and incidents. If your child has an accident in school you will be Informed and asked to sign our accident record. We may ask you to sign a form if your child comes to school with an injury of any sort—this is to ensure that we know that he/she has not sustained the injury at school and your are aware of it. All our policies are available on request and on the school website. Please take the time to read these policies.

#### **Foody Things**

Your child will be provided with toast and a drink at the beginning of their sessions. Milk and fruit is provided on a daily basis for the children. Drinking water is always available throughout the day. Cooking with the children is part of our curricular activities. We enjoy celebrating and sharing food from different countries.

# How can I help my child?

All children are eager to explore and investigate. You can encourage their interest in learning simply by talking with your children about everyday experiences: shopping trips, cooking the tea, sharing books at bedtimes.

Ask your child what they have been doing at Nursery. Sometimes they won't respond but they will appreciate your interest. Visit our Website to see what learning has been taking place.

Read stories and rhymes with your child. We have a weekly Story Book Club where you can borrow a book to share.

# **Health and Safety**

Forest school at Low Hill Nursery is all about offering our children exciting experiences. This will involve discovering the outdoor classroom. During these sessions we will use equipment not usually offered to children. This will be done in strict safety conditions enabling your child to learn by risk taking. While we do wish to protect the health and well being of your children we also want them to experience a wealth of knowledge. This will be supported by experiencing all weather conditions. For this reason we ask you to

provide suitable clothing for your child, like a warm coat in cooler weather, sensible shoes and clothes that you do not mind getting dirty. This will enable us to provide your child with many new learning experiences.

We aim to keep your children safe at all times. As part of our curriculum we encourage a range of activities to help keep your children healthy. Our outdoor curriculum reflects our indoor educational provision. You can access our Health & Safety Policy on our website www.lowhillnursery.co.uk

#### **Golden Rules**

Bring your child to Nursery as regularly as possible and on time for the start of their sessions.

Nursery and Toddler sessions start at 8.30 am for the morning children and at 12.30 pm for those who attend in the afternoon.

Sunflower sessions for Nursery aged children start at 9 am for morning children and 12.30pm for afternoon children. Children who stay all day start at 9am and leave at 3pm.

#### Collect your child on time.

Collection times are:

11.30 am for morning children 3.30 pm for afternoon children 12 noon for morning Sunflowers children and 3 pm for all day Sunflowers and afternoon Sunflowers children.

We offer a 30 hour provision. You are eligible if... All parents in the household work at least 16 hours per week at the National minimum or living wage. Please speak to Pauline or Jas if you think you may qualify. 30 hour children attend between 8.30 am and 2.30 pm. We offer an extension to this facility so that your child can stay at Nursery until 3.30 pm. There is a charge of £5 per day for this provision. Ensure that you inform us in advance if you need anyone else to collect your child from nursery and please ensure that this person is over the age of 16 and has access to your password.

Please inform us if your child is ill and is not able to attend. You can call the school office on 01902 558124 at anytime and leave a message.

If your child is diagnosed with any medical condition that may require us to administer any medicines, it is your responsibility to inform the school immediately so that we can complete the relevant medical plan and ensure your child's safety whilst in school.

**No Mobile phones** are allowed in the classrooms so please ensure you put your phone away whilst dropping off or picking up your child.

#### **Aims**

At Low Hill Nursery School we are committed to working together as a partnership with parents, community and practitioners.

We believe that all children have the right to:

A happy, caring and nurturing environment where all children can reach their full potential within the provision of a truly holistic approach to learning.

A rich, stimulating and exciting curriculum which recognises children's learning styles, promotes self esteem and independence and encourages enquiring minds.

A balance of child initiated and adult focussed learning.

A safe and secure environment, where Children are challenged, allowed to make choices, predict, evaluate and make decisions.



# **Our Approach to Learning**

We believe in an holistic approach to learning, understanding and recognising that children have individual learning styles.

The child, the family and their wellbeing is the heart of everything we do.

We believe home, school and practitioner work together to ensure all children are able to reach their full potential.

We believe that our children's learning begins in the home. We support and extend their learning by providing a challenging, stimulating, well resourced, well organised environment which enables each child to develop physically, socially, emotionally, intellectually, morally and spiritually.

We implement the Early Years Foundation Stage recognising that play based activities and opportunities to investigate, explore, enquire, predict and evaluate can take place in a climate without fear or compromise.

We believe every child has a right to a safe, secure environment where everyone regardless of gender, culture, ethnicity or Special Needs are treated as individuals and can derive pleasure, independence and confidence through learning.

We ensure that all staff are well qualified and highly skilled in order to have high expectations of the children and are able to deliver a quality curriculum which meets individual needs.

We celebrate every milestone, however small. We promote opportunities to share learning experiences with the wider community.

# Things you need to know

Please dress your child in practical clothes. We enjoy a range of creative activities (jelly, paint and spaghetti can be messy).

For your child's safety please ensure their footwear is practical.

Studs only in ears please. There is nothing more painful than catching an earring on clothing. We will not be held responsible for any accidents that occur due to the wearing of jewellery.

Your child may need changing during the nursery session. Please ensure that your child always has a change of underwear (or nappies) and clean clothes in a **named bag** to leave on their peg. We cannot provide a change of clothes or nappies for your child.

If you are not able to collect your child yourself, in the interests of safeguarding, please inform the office or keyworker giving details of the person you have nominated to collect your child. Please ensure that you inform the office or nursery staff of any change in mobile or other telephone numbers, or update this on our Sims system through our Website.

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea they need to be kept at home for **48** (**forty eight**) hours after the last **occurrence** before returning to Nursery.

Finally we do ask for £1 a week for School Fund. This helps towards the cost of breakfast club and cooking activities.

If you feel you have any problem or concern at any time - please see your child's practitioner who will discuss these issues with you. If you still feel that matters have not been resolved then you can make an appointment to speak with the Head Teacher or Pastoral Manager. Natalie Showell or Michelle Dudley will ensure that they speak with you as soon as they are available.
